- Home Learning Challenge sheet 'Under the Sea' - see attached
- Can you look at the pictures of under the sea and write some phrases and simple sentences to go with them? - see attached
- Can you choose an animal from under the sea and write an acrostic poem for it?
- Can you complete the under the sea science experiments and draw and write about what happened? 'Floating Egg', 'Frozen Sea', 'How Fish Breathe' and 'Salt Water Density' - see attached

- Can you choose an animal you might find under the sea e.g. dolphins, jellyfish, whales, sharks, octopus, then use the internet (with adult support) and find out about your chosen animal? Once you have found out about the animal can you write up 2 or 3 facts about it?
- Can you create an underwater scene? For this, you may want to use a box - see photos below for ideas.
- Can you draw/paint/make (junk modelling/clay/playdough/salt dough) an animal or an object found under the sea?
- Can you complete the under the sea wordsearches? - see attached
- Can you complete the rhyming words sheet? - see attached

The first letter of each line spells out the poem's theme vertically – what's this one about?

- Acrostic poems have their theme or title written down the page vertically
- Write the theme letters in CAPITALS.
- Each line starts with a letter of the theme word(s).
- Acrostics don't have to rhyme, but all the other poetic devices (alliteration, similes, rhythm, etc.) are great!
