- Home Learning Challenge sheet 'Little Red Riding Hood' - see attached
- Can you design a basket for Little Red Riding Hood? You could draw a basket; make a basket by weaving paper or card; or make out of materials you have at home
- What could you put in the basket to make it healthy? What might be in an unhealthy basket? - Draw or paint these
- Can you think and write a question you might like to ask each character?
- Can you create a wanted poster for the Big Bad Wolf? - see attached
- Can you write a speech bubble for some of the characters in the story? - see attached
- Can you sort the character descriptions to the right character? - see attached
- Can you make a map of Little Red Riding Hood's walk through the woods?
- Can you complete the Little Red Riding Hood wordsearch? - see attached

- Can you write a THOUGHT bubble for each character in the story? - What might the characters be thinking?
- Can you record a video of you retelling the story/part of the story or talking about your favourite part of the story?
- Make stick puppets or masks
- Make the characters you have made to retell the story
- Can you put the pictures of the story in the right order? - see attached OR you may want to draw your pictures, cut them out and put them in the right order.
- Order the pictures and write a sentence for each part of the story - use your sounds to write independently - see attached
- Can you write the story or part of the story - using your sounds to help you and draw a picture/pictures to go with it?
- Can you draw/paint your favourite part of the story and write a sentence about it?
