Maths Home Learning Challenges - Doubling

Hello Reception,

As we mentioned last week, if we was currently at school, our topic would be 'Spectacular Stories and Super Seaside'. For the first half term, we would be focusing on traditional tales including: Goldilocks and the Three Bears, The Three Little Pigs, The Gingerbread Man, Little Red Riding Hood and The Three Billy Goats Gruff.

Each week, we will read a different traditional tale to the children followed by giving some ideas that you could do with the children throughout the week (or ALL of them if you like a challenge). You can put work up on Tapestry and/or send it to the email address: photos@canvey-inf.essex.sch.uk if you would like any photos to go on the 'Weekly Gallery' on the school website or on the school Facebook group.

This week's story is 'The Three Little Pigs'. You can watch the video of me reading the story on Tapestry.

Here is a range of ideas you could do surrounding this traditional tale - some are the same as last week as they link to all traditional tales. There are also some resources to support some of these ideas - please see other attachments. We hope these help.

- Home Learning Challenge sheet 'The Three Little Pigs' - see attached
- Create a wanted poster for the Big Bad Wolf
- Can you write a letter from the Big Bad Wolf apologising to the pigs?
- Can you write a speech bubble for each character in the story? - What did they say? - use your sounds to write independently - see attached
- Can you record a video of you retelling the story/part of the story or talking about your favourite part of the story?
- Can you look around your house, find 3 different materials/toys and create a house out of each one? Then you could use a hairdryer (the Big Bad Wolf huffing and puffing) to test your houses. Can you say which is the strongest/best house/material? Can you say which is the weakest/worst? Can you say why?
- Big Bad Wolf Huff and Puff Experiment - see attached
- Can you research pigs and/or wolves? Draw a picture and write down some facts about them. You may want to do this in the form of a fact file.

- Can you find out about different types of homes?
- Can you write a description about one of the characters - see attached
- Make the characters to use to retell the story using junk modelling
- Make stick puppets or masks
- Can you put the pictures of the story in the right order? - see attached OR you may want to draw your own pictures, cut them out and put them in the right order.
- Order the pictures and write a sentence for each part of the story - use your sounds to write independently - see attached
- Can you write the story or part of the story - using your sounds to help you and draw a picture/pictures to go with it?
- Can you draw/paint your favourite part of the story and write a sentence about it?
